### <u>Parents as Partners</u>

"Parents are children's first and most enduring educators. When parents and practitioners work together, the results have a positive impact on children's development and learning."

Children do not necessarily have the same background or experiences, so they will enter school at different starting points. At Lydiard Millicent CE Primary, we are aware of this and aim to provide the very best education for every child.

Within the first few weeks of starting school, the team will spend time getting to know your child. We will complete a baseline assessment to build up a picture of the kinds of things your child can do and the skills they need to develop. These assessments will continue throughout the year in order for us to continue to teach your child their next steps.

We will provide your child with situations which involve confidence building, as well as fostering independence, therefore making the transition to school a positive experience. Children who feel confident about themselves and are able to enter new situations, knowing that their parents and the people around them are working together in partnership to support and encourage them, will make positive steps towards learning.

The school is committed to an open door policy. There are lots of opportunities for parents to communicate with school including class assemblies, curriculum meetings and parents' meetings. We also encourage you to discuss any queries you may have regarding your child with the class teacher who will be available at the beginning or end of every day.

### The School Day

The school gates will be open from 8.30 am.

The class teacher will come onto the playground at 8.45 am and, from this time, the children can enter the classroom. School officially starts at 8.55 am and anybody arriving after this time will be considered late and marked as late on the school system. Any late arrivals must then sign in at the office.

If your child is not able to attend school for any reason, please contact the school office or leave a message on the school phone system at the earliest opportunity and no later than 8.55 am for each day of absence.

#### Break

All children have a short mid-morning break.

#### Lunch

KS1 and EYFS lunch starts at 12 noon and KS2 lunch starts at 12:15 pm. The afternoon session starts at 1 pm.

### End of Day

At 3 pm KS1 and EYFS finish school followed by KS2 at 3:05 pm. Children will be supervised until their parents/carers arrive unless alternative arrangements have been made.

### Breakfast Club

If you wish for your child to attend the breakfast club, you will need to register your child requesting the sessions you require. Cost of breakfast care is £3.50, this includes a choice of cereals and toast. Drop off in the morning is from 7.30. A registration form can be requested from the school office and will be sent via ParentMail.

### Appointments

We would appreciate it if medical appointments could be made outside the school day to ensure your child's learning is not disrupted.

### Golden Mile

The Golden Mile is an exciting and measurable health & physical activity accessible to all. Children walk or run around the route that we have created at school. Over a period of 10 minutes, staff will tally the number of laps each child completes. Eight laps of our route is equivalent to one mile. We have an online system which converts the laps into miles and will keep staff informed of the children's progress. Award certificates are given out to children at Merit Assembly on a Friday.

#### Collective Worship

An act of collective worship is held daily for all children. Collective worship may be led by school staff, children, and other visitors to the school. Throughout the year, each class will lead two class worships, to which parents are invited.

#### Clubs

We run a range of school clubs that change on a termly basis. Letters giving full details of clubs, days, times and how to sign up will be sent out at the beginning of each term.

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### School Uniform

School uniform is encouraged, as it is both practical and helps to promote a sense of school identity and belonging.

Acceptable school uniform is: School fleece School sweatshirt White polo shirt Grey skirt or pinafore dress Green and white check/stripe dress (summer) Grey trousers Trainers

PE Kit Green or black jogging bottoms for cold/swimming days Green sweatshirt/Lydiard Millicent Hoodie White t-shirt Green shorts Trainers

The children wear PE kit to school on PE days and wear trainers every day. This is because we are a very active school and the children, as well as running the golden mile every morning, are often outside as part of their learning.

**NB**. Children are only permitted to wear stud earrings but they must be able to remove or tape these independently for PE lessons.

### Checklist for the first day of school:

- Named school book bag
- Named packed lunch, if not having a school lunch
- Named water bottle full of water only
- Named coat

Make sure all the above are clearly labelled with your child's name and class. It's also worth making sure they are easily identifiable by your child. Many children like to hang something, for example a small key ring, to their school book bag so they instantly know which one is theirs. Please don't send your child in with a back pack as our cloakrooms just aren't big enough to store them.

You will have received the induction timetable and so will know which sessions your child will be in school. On arrival, please take your child onto the playground and wait close to the EYFS gate. A member of the EYFS team will take your child into the classroom. To develop your child's independence, we ask that the children enter the classroom independently, and we support them to look for their peg, so they can hang up their own coat and if having a packed lunch, can place their lunchbox in the allocated space. Water bottles can be stored in the classroom so that children can access them easily during the day. On collection at the end of the session, please wait close to the EYFS gate and we will bring the children out to meet you. If arrangements for collecting your child change, and a different adult will be collecting them after school, please contact the school office informing them of the name of the adult, so this information can be passed on to the class teacher.

During the induction sessions, your child may be arriving or leaving outside of the usual drop off and pick up times. Where this is the case, please wait by the large green gate and a member of staff will let you in at the appropriate time.

### Lunch, Snack and Cool Milk

#### Hot Lunches

Our lunches are prepared on site in our super facilities and served by Tracey and Gill (they are friendly and always smiling!).

We are very proud of our lunchtimes - we try to make them fun and sociable for the children. The children sit at tables with their classmates and collect their meals from the serving hatch. They have water to drink on the tables or squash on special occasions! School Lunch menus rotate over a three weekly cycle and children can also enjoy regular themed meals such as World Book Day. Meals will be ordered online via the School Food United App, allowing parents to book meals in advance and up to 5pm the night before. A School Food United App registration link and letter will be sent out via ParentMail.

The menu can be found on the website and is sent home via ParentMail so that you are able to discuss the choices with your child and help them to make their decisions.

### Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM)

Under the Government's Universal Infant Free School Meals scheme, all children in EYFS and KS1 can receive a free school meal. If you prefer them to bring a packed lunch, please provide one. Once they move to KS2, school meals are chargeable.

### Packed Lunches

Packed lunches must be named and should include a named water bottle (this can be the same water bottle for use in class). Some children in school have severe allergies to nuts, **please do not send in any nuts or items such as peanut butter in sandwiches**.

Healthy Schools Guidelines suggest that your child's lunchbox should contain:

- starchy foods these are bread, rice, potatoes, pasta and others
- protein foods including meat, fish, eggs, beans and others
- a dairy item this could be cheese or a yoghurt
- vegetables or salad and a portion of fruit

Starchy foods are a good source of energy and should make up a third of the lunchbox. But don't let things get boring. Instead of sandwiches, why not try bagels, pitta bread, wraps and baguettes. Try to use brown, wholemeal or seeded bread, not white bread.

**Please do not pack sweets or chocolate bars**. We will do our best to encourage children to eat as much of their lunch as possible.

### Healthy snacks

In EYFS and KS1, fruit and/or vegetables are offered free of charge every morning snack time. If you would rather send in your own snack, you can put this into their school bag, so long as it is fruit or vegetables. No crisps, breakfast bars, chocolate or sweets are allowed. KS2 parents will need to provide a healthy snack if their child would like one.

### Cool Milk

We encourage parents to register their child with Cool Milk and receive milk each day at break time. Milk is an ideal mid-morning drink for your child and milk is free if your child is under the age of five or if you have a child receiving or entitled to free school meals (not UIFSM). If your child is over five and is not in receipt of free school meals, there is a small cost of around £15 each term. Please register online by visiting the cool milk website http://www.coolmilk.com/ and select 'Register your child' option on the left hand side.

### Serious Allergies

Please note that due to serious allergies we aim to be a nut free school.

### Annual Report and Parents' Evenings

Parents will receive an annual written report in July each year. In addition, we will hold two parents' evenings a year; these are an opportunity to discuss your child's progress with their teacher. However, if you have any concerns regarding either your child's progress or well-being, please do not wait until parents' evening but book an appointment to talk with your child's teacher after school.

### School Website, Facebook and Twitter

We are very excited to announce that the school has a brand new website, which is a fabulous source of information. We also have a Facebook and Twitter account which is updated with snippets of school life.

### Communication with Parents



Communicating with parents is an important part of what we do, making sure you get the correct information about activities, events and things that really matter is something we care about.

Please check your child's book bag regularly - we will send home letters and leaflets informing you of events, requesting information etc. Copies of all letters and newsletters can also be found on our website. We use ParentMail to send letters and forms for trips. Payments can be made using ParentMail via the app or website.

To use the latest version of ParentMail all you need to do is verify your account. If you have both a mobile number and an email address registered on your account, you will receive a registration invitation by text and email. You can decide which way you register - but you will only need to register once.

Please be assured that ParentMail is registered with the Information Commissioner and guarantees that all information you provide will be kept private and will not be passed on to any other organisation. We recommend downloading and using the app to avoid having to login each time you receive a notification.

If you have any questions about ParentMail, please don't hesitate to speak to the office.

On a Friday, we send out a newsletter to parents via Sway.

## First Aid

School staff will administer minor first aid if your child has a fall or bump. It is school policy to inform parents whenever a child has a bump to the head. We will also contact you if we believe your child needs medical attention or if they appear unwell during the course of the day and need to go home.

If your child has a course of prescribed medication that has to be taken four times a day, or at set times during the school day, a form (available from the school office) must be completed prior to any medication being given by school staff. Please note that no member of staff is under any obligation to administer medication to a child - but they are usually quite happy to help. All medication must be taken to the school office. We are unable to administer any non-prescribed medication to children under any circumstances.

If your child suffers from asthma, please ensure that this is recorded on your child's registration form and that a reliever inhaler is always available for use within school. The inhaler should be periodically checked by parents to ensure that it is within its expiry date and has sufficient doses remaining.

We must be notified of any medical needs your child has. Please provide information on the registration form. Remember to update this if this changes.

# Travel to School and Keep Safe

Please remember that there is no access to The Butts and school for cars at drop off or pick up time:

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8:30 am - 9:15 am and 2:45 pm - 3:30 pm
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This is because the lane to school is very narrow. We allow staff to travel up and parents with disabilities and residents of The Butts only.

There is also no parking at the end of the lane in front of the bollards, this is a quick drop off only. Please be aware that there is a private house entrance here which must not be blocked.

If parents park here and a coach is due to take the children on a trip, they have to walk into the road to get on the coach, this is extremely dangerous.

# How can I travel to school safely?

### Free Transport

Wiltshire Council provides free transport, with supervised drop off and pick up on the school premises, if you live in catchment and meet one of the following:

- No safe walking route
- Age under 8 and over 2 miles away
- Age over 8 and over 3 miles away (2 miles for children who receive free school meals or those receiving the maximum level of working tax credit)

# Walking

If you live in Lydiard Millicent, please try to walk all the way to school (staff too). Most children from the village choose this healthy option. It's a great way to meet and chat with friends on the way.

# Lift-sharing

Although it takes a bit of effort to get sorted, lift sharing reduces congestion, lets you have days off with the school run and children love to share with a friend as they have more time with each other. Ask around in your year group to find a lift share partner - it could be for 7 years!

### Park and Walk

We ask that all parents park safely around our school locality and that access to the lane and driveways is never compromised.

If you drive into the village, please remember:

- Drive carefully for everyone's safety
- Parking is very limited near the school, parking near Manor Farm can block the road on a blind corner, so leave lots of space between cars
- The Parish Hall has no parking on Wednesdays and limited parking due to clubs on other days.

### What Do I Do If...?

#### My Child has a Medical Appointment

As much as possible, we ask that medical appointments are made out of school time. However, we do understand that it is not always possible, so when an appointment has been made please let the school office know. When you come to collect your child for your appointment, we ask for you to come to the office and sign your child out in a separate register.

#### My child is absent from school through illness

If your child is absent from school through illness, it is important that you inform the school by 8.55 am on each day of illness. If your child has had sickness and/or diarrhoea, please ensure they remain off school for 48 hours after the last incident.

#### I would like to take my child out of school for a holiday

The Department for Education states; every day at school counts enormously and so does every consecutive day attended by pupils. Parents do not have a legal right to take children out of school. Head teachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. Exceptional circumstances are defined as:

- unusual; not typical
- forming an exception or rare instance; unusual; extraordinary.

If the absence has not been authorised by the school and an absence occurs, where the child's total unauthorised absences amounts to 10 or more sessions (5 school days), continuous or aggregated within the previous six months within the current academic year (including the most recent unauthorised absence), a penalty notice will be issued and the school will notify the Education Welfare Service.

#### I do not wish for my child to have their photo taken

Throughout your child's time at Lydiard Millicent CE Primary, your child will have the opportunity to have their photographs taken many times, whether it is for the local paper, during school plays, or for the school brochures and website. We do understand that there are circumstances in which parents may not wish their child to be photographed. An option to opt out of this is provided on the registration form.

#### <u>I have changed my emergency contact number(s)</u>

If any of the particulars you have given us change for any reason, please let us know as soon as possible, this way we will be able to contact you immediately should your child become ill or have an accident.
