

### English (including phonics)

Review and consolidate phase 3 consonant and vowel digraphs and use these to read and write words.

Use phonic knowledge to write sentences, leaving spaces between words and using full stops.

Introduce capital letters for the beginning of sentences.

Write for a range of purposes.

Read a range of books, using phonic knowledge to decode words.

Continue to learn more 'tricky words' for reading.

*Home learning idea: Write a note to a family member/friend.*

### Topic

Share photographs of wonderful places visited and compare similarities and differences.

Learn about the work of Guiseppe Archimboldo and create own portraits using fruit and vegetables.

Research facts about space, using non-fiction books and the internet.

*Home learning idea: Make a picture, using any media, of a favourite place.*

### Maths

To count on and back beyond 10.  
To recognise numbers to 20, and beyond.

Exploring patterns by copying, continuing and creating a widening range of repeating patterns.

*Home learning idea: Play snakes and ladders, encouraging your child to count on using the numbers on the board.*
